

**MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL MEETING**  
**August 17, 1998**

Mayor Marjorie Rogers brought the meeting to order at 1:00 PM. Four aldermen were present: Allen Maxedon, Fritz Lorentzen, Hobie Weisman and Buddy White. Jay Torbit and Attorney Mark Johnson were absent. Also present was Recorder-Treasurer, Susan Maynard.

The minutes of the July 17th meeting were read, discussed and corrected. Mr. Maxedon motioned the minutes be accepted as corrected. Mr. Weisman seconded. Vote was taken. Motion passed unanimously. The minutes of the July 20th meeting were read, discussed and corrected. Mr. Weisman motioned the minutes be accepted as corrected. Mr. Maxedon seconded. Vote was taken. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. White made a motion to pay the list of Accounts Payable totaling \$ 3,237.05. Mr. Lorentzen seconded. Vote was taken. Motion passed unanimously.

Mrs. Maynard and Mrs. Rogers explained the recording of the forgiven debt to C.C.C.

Mrs. Maynard presented information from Computer Systems of Arkansas, Inc. pertaining to city government software. Topic was discussed, and information will be on file and available to the new government.

The Street Turnback account balance is \$7,624.92.

Mr. White, Mr. Torbit and Ray Maynard met with Mr. Kirkpatrick of the State Roads Dept. Mr. Kirkpatrick meets with cities and advises them what actions to take with their roads. He explained we have three types of roads in the Village: high speed/high volume, secondary, and roads with one or no houses. He further explained patching and how it should be done, and proper drainage. He suggested the drainage ditches on primary roads should be the first action, and to continue to chip and seal the secondary roads. He has put us on their newsletter mailing list. Mr. Torbit reported he felt it was a positive meeting and we are lucky that S.I.D. has been doing a good job maintaining the roads and are not behind. Mayor Rogers would like the Committee to get together with S.I.D. and report to us in September; also to check with Horseshoe Bend.

Mrs. Rogers reported the telephone company no longer has a one-year contract for long distance service. We will be charged twelve cents per minute for each long distance call.

Mr. Torbit called the Municipal League regarding city by-laws and charters. The League stated we have to have neither. The Mayor can go ahead and appoint committees, but has put a hold on forming a Planning Committee.

No one attended August Quorum Court meetings due to weather. Meetings will be Monday September 14, 6:00 PM, Sharp County Courthouse; 7:00 PM, Fulton County Courthouse. Mrs. Rogers would appreciate anyone who is able to attend.

Mrs. Rogers will ask Attorney Johnson to give a presentation regarding the expanding of the Cherokee Sanitary Landfill at the September meeting.

Mayor Rogers has sent a letter to the Acting Director of the Census Bureau in Washington, DC regarding the Census. They had previously told her they could not do a "Big Cat" or Tabletop Census as all the workers were involved with the upcoming 2000 Census.

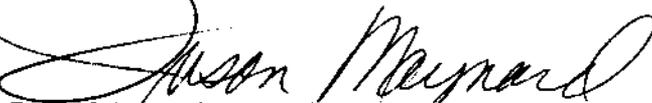
