

CITY OF CHEROKEE VILLAGE, ARKANSAS
City Council Minutes
April 19, 1999

The regular monthly meeting was called to order at 1:00 PM Monday, April 19, 1999 by Mayor Marjorie Rogers. The meeting was held in the Recreation Room at Omaha Center.

MINUTES:

Motion to approve the March 15, 1999 minutes as presented was made by Joe Waggoner and seconded by Louisa Relyea. With a voice vote of six ayes, motion carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Financial reports were reviewed and will be filed for audit.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Mayor Rogers asked for an alderman to represent the City on the Municipal League Resolution Committee. Mr. Radebaugh volunteered.

The DAR invited us to attend a tree planting at the South Golf Course Friday April 28 at 10:00 AM.

REPORTS:

Airport: Mrs. Relyea will find out when the airport's next meeting is and contact all who wish to attend. All business will be tabled until our next meeting.

Animal Control: Mayor Rogers, Dan Dennis, Hobie Weisman and Ginnie Skowlund met with Wanda at the North Arkansas Boarding Kennel. She is willing to keep her costs at \$4.00 per day. They also talked with the North Arkansas Veterinary Clinic. Drs. Mills are willing to continue to cooperate with the City and will get us a copy of their charges. Mrs. Skowlund will continue keeping adoption records and will pay for the radio advertising. Three people have been interviewed for the position of Animal Control Officer. One person declined the position so we will be doing more interviews. Mr. Dennis motioned to place an ad in the paper giving a grace period of 30 days to obtain a pet license. Ad would contain a coupon that could be sent in the mail to facilitate people who cannot come to the office. Mrs. Relyea seconded. With a voice vote of six ayes, motion carried unanimously. Ordinance 99-4 does have provisions for the ACO to issue summons.

Beautification: Mr. Waggoner reported we will have a Village-wide clean-up effort May 14 – 15. It will be sponsored by the Lions Club, Kiwanis, POA, SID, Daggett Development and IESI. Three dumpsters will be strategically placed around the Village: Pioneer Auction, intersection of

Pottawattamie & Onago, and behind the SID Administration building. Hours are 9 – 6 Friday and 9 – 2 Saturday. Tires, car batteries, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioning units, yard waste and hazardous materials will not be accepted. It will be advertised in the papers, radio and through flyers.

Budget: No report.

Emergency Services: Mrs. Relyea is working on an ordinance and invited volunteers to help.

Planning and Zoning: A meeting will be held regarding Worker's Compensation Wednesday, April 28 at 3:00 PM at the United Methodist Church. An attorney from the W/C Commission is to give a lecture with discussion after. Jim Linville is to write a column for the papers to dispel rumors.

Police and Security: Dan Dennis made a motion to authorize the release of \$4,500 to S.I.D which was budgeted to make up for the Sharp Co. deficit. Joe Waggoner seconded. With a voice vote of six ayes, motion carried unanimously. A check will be presented to them at the meeting we will have with them in the near future.

Roads: No report

Mayor Rogers reported the POA meeting where the City was the topic was well accepted. She has received no negative comments. She commented of how proud she was of all the aldermen, their reports, etc.

OLD BUSINESS:

Clerk/Treasurer Maynard read **An Ordinance for the Adoption of the Municipal Budget.** Mayor Rogers declared the Ordinance open for discussion. Mr. Betz moved to waive the rules and place the Ordinance on its second reading, title only. Ray Torbit seconded the motion. With a roll call vote of six ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

2nd Reading – Clerk/Treasurer Maynard read the Ordinance, title only.

Discussion –

Ray Torbit moved to waive the rules and place the Ordinance on its third and final reading, title only. Louisa Relyea seconded the motion. With a roll call vote of six ayes, 0 nays, motion carried.

3rd and Final Reading – Clerk/Treasurer Maynard read the Ordinance, title only, for the third time.
