REPORTS:

Airport: No report.

Roads: Bid opening for 4.1 miles of Pottawattamie Dr. will be September 1 at 11:00 AM.

Animal Control: Mr. Dennis reported Garland Minton has resigned. Auxiliary police officer Mark Long acted as interim officer. Reserve Officer Russell Holt has been hired and started August 14. He will work not less than 20 hours at \$7.50 per hour. He works at Basehart Station as a dispatcher.

Building Committee: McNulty Plumbing will be doing the plumbing work and Richard's Heating and Cooling will be doing that work. We are back on budget. The store has been cleaned out. Lines have been marked on the floor to represent the offices and other rooms. We have hired Boyd House as a part-time custodian.

Census: Ray Torbit reported that the census is complete in Cherokee Village.

Cherokee Village Promotion: Oral Henderson reported that a crew has been here from KAIT-TV. He has met with the Municipal Development Committee and discussed mutual ideas.

Emergency Services: Mrs. Rogers reported the FEMA flood map is being worked on. Tom Hrezo and Mrs. Relyea may attend classes later this year.

Environmental: Mr. Betz reported his committee is still working on mandatory trash. Mr. Johnson has made up an addendum to the original tract contract with I.E.S.I. We have received checks and have sent out ten trash variance cards. Grant applications have been sent out to clean up dumpsites. We will wait for an answer.

Planning & Zoning: It was reported that there was a good outcome on the court case and the Commission is tying up loose ends of the case.

Police and Security: Dan Dennis reported two of our present police officers have been scheduled to attend the academy; one in September and one in February. The Auxiliary Police are working out very well. The deputation of our officers in Fulton County is still questionable, and we will stay in touch with the Sheriff. Within the next month we will be selecting a Lieutenant who will be on a six-month probationary period.

Website: Mr. Henderson said the website has been redone and enhanced and is online now.

OLD BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS:

Judge Everett announced there is a burn-ban in Fulton County. Mayor Rogers called the Fire Chief and he agreed the City should have one also. Sharp County Judge Crawford has agreed to back us. He also has included all of Sharp County.

Mrs. Rogers reported she attended a Municipal League Seminar including the Cash Management Trust, of which she is a board member. Highland has just joined. She said it was a very good seminar.

Ray Torbit will act as Mayor while Mrs. Rogers is out of town.
