Section 1: That the National Incident Management System dated March 1, 2004, be and it is hereby adopted.

Section 2: This ordinance being necessary to apply for federal grants to assist in the operation of the City, to avoid the foregoing of any revenues which shall be collected to assist in the operations of the City and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Cherokee Village, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
